


A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT THE SORRY MUM PROJECT

Initially I wrote a few stories about all the strange things my Mum has cried over. I thought it was funny and sometimes it was, but sometimes it really wasn't. It got me thinking about my relationship with my Mum and how we'd made it through the rough years and pretended nothing had happened. But it did happen and sometimes I see the cracks of what I did to her over the years appear and I need her to know I am sorry.

It's strange but often after Mum and I argued, instead of comforting her I would think 'It's okay because one day I'll do a big show or something and apologise all at once'. Which is what every Mum wants right? To be ignored and mistreated and then 'SURPRISE here's a show all about how I mistreated you and by the way I'm sorry!'

It's really not the best method and I acknowledge that now. I'm still doing the show though and that's because my Mum loves it. There are also Mums I see in the audience that I hope know that they are loved and grown-up children in the audience that consider giving their Mum a call. That's all I want from this show, for someone to call their Mum/Mother figure and ask how they are.



A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT LET ME KNOW WHEN YOU GET HOME

Growing up queer, Filipinx and isolated, it never helped me to hear adults say that 'it gets better.' I didn't want to wait until I escaped the suburbs and was able to move to Sydney, Melbourne, San Francisco or some other seemingly mythical queer utopia. I just wanted to feel less lonely.

I wrote *Let Me Know When You Get Home* as a coming-of-age story for young folks that understands how out-of-reach 'escaping' your racist, homophobic and transphobic community can be. I wanted a work that didn't say, 'it gets better,' but instead tells young people, 'I know it sucks right now, so I'm going to stay here with you.'

So, for every queer person who has been told they need to 'escape' Western Sydney: I wrote this for you, no matter whether you left, stayed, or came back. Everyone deserves to feel safe, loved and accepted. I hope this work feels like home to you.

Pippa is a writer/performer from Western Sydney. Her first play *The Carousel* was

shortlisted for the Rodney Seaborne Playwrights Award in 2015. The Carousel went on to have multiple seasons (produced by Shopfront Arts Co-op, performed at Belvoir St Downstairs theatre, produced and performed at both Merrigong Theatre company as part of Merrigong X and bAKEHOUSE's Step up Festival at KXT). Pippa's monologue *#nofilter* was published and performed as part of ATYP's Intersection 2018: Chrysalis. In 2018 Pippa wrote, performed and toured her first solo show The Sorry Mum Project (Bondi Feast Festival 2018, Adelaide Fringe festival 2019). She recently presented an excerpt of her latest play Band-aid Boy as part of Old 505's Rapid Reads. Alongside her collaborator/director Hannah Goodwin, Pippa was a resident artist at both Shopfront Arts Co-op and Q Theatre. Pippa was also selected for various creative programs including ATYP's 'National Studio' and 'Fresh Ink program', Q Theatre and ATYP's 'Propel initiative' and National Theatre of Parramatta's 'Creative Futures' program. Pippa is a founding member of Pip and Han Inc. a company dedicated to creating dynamic new Australian works.

In 2019 Hannah was awarded the ATYP Rose Byrne Leadership Scholarship, recognising her as an emerging arts leader. She is the current Andrew Cameron Fellow at Belvoir Street Theatre.




MELANIE LIERTZ Set and Costume Designer She/Her
