A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

I've always been intrigued with the relationships we have with our bodies and what we deem as attractive or 'enough' to be content. Furthermore, I wanted to explore the consequences of not being 'enough'. The notion that we have to change who we are physically to be enough. To be 'chosen'. With Fatima, I wanted to go further and interrogate the complex hierarchies of Lebanese Australian culture, and what it means for a confident, thirty something woman to love her body, but at the same time, is taught to be ashamed?

Queen Fatima plays snakes and ladders with status, class, identity and sacrifice. Throw in a Lebanese beauty pageant and I could find a better way to bring these themes to the boil.

There are choices that Fatima makes, that we've all had to make at some point. But Fatima isn't a victim of the choices her family, boyfriend or the pageant. She doesn't suffer fools, and with a strong interior and exterior, she begins to pull the reigns on anything that stands in the way of her of showing the world what she's made of. Fatima is boisterous, confident and loving. But above all, she is human, with flaws and strengths. And with that, naming her a 'Queen' feels admittedly truthful, in all its glory.

IAMES ELAZZI Playwright

We are pleased to welcome back James after Riverside's National Theatre of Parramatta's production of

Lady Tabouli (2020). James is a young playwright who has made guite a splash in the last couple of years. His play Lady Tabouli (Riverside's National Theatre of Parramatta for Sydney Festival) enjoyed a sold-out season in 2020 and as did his play Omar and Dawn (Apocalypse Theatre Co and Green Door Theatre for Kings Cross Theatre) in 2019. He was also granted a place in the 2019-21 Sydney Theatre Company Emerging Writers' Program and was named one of the 2020 AMP Tomorrow Makers for Excellence in Writing for Screen/Stage receiving an award and grant for his work. In 2018 his plays were selected for readings at Kings Cross Theatre's Storytellers Festival, the Siren Theatre's Playwriting Festival and the National Playwriting Festival. James was also selected to take part in the WestWords' writing residency in Varuna. In 2017, James was selected for two National Theatre of Parramatta programs for emerging artists, 'Page to Stage' and 'Creative Futures'. His play Son of Byblos (finalist for the Silver Gull Play Award) was programmed as part of the Belvoir's 25a 2020 season but was unfortunately postpone due to COVID-19.



Paige is currently Sydney Theatre Company's Associate Director, after holding the role of Associate Artistic Director

at Queensland Theatre. Prior to that, she was Sydney Theatre Company's Richard Wherrett Fellow and has previously directed Triple X. The Deep Blue Sea, The Beauty Queen of Leenane, How to Rule the World, Black is the New White, Australian Graffiti, Power Plays and Boys will be boys for STC. Paige was co-founder of independent theatre company Arthur, was the 2011 Resident Director at Griffin Theatre Company as well as the company's 2010 Affiliate Director. Other directing credits include, Queensland Theatre: Hedda, Scenes from a Marriage, Switzerland. Belvoir: Fangirls (with Queensland Theatre in association with ATYP). Arthur: Bright World (with Theatreworks), The Sea Project, Return to Earth (with Griffin Independent), The Myth Project: Twin (with MTC NEON), The Mesh (with Red Stitch) The Midlands (with Mudlark), Dirtvland (with The Spare Room), Cut Snake. Milk Crate Theatre: This House is Mine. Paige won Best Direction of a Mainstage Production for The Beauty Queen of Leenane and Best Production of a Mainstage Musical for Fangirls at the 2019 Sydney Theatre Awards, Best Mainstage Production at the 2016 Matilda Awards for Switzerland. She is a graduate of NIDA.
